Nepal Mission - November 2016

It was a real pleasure to be able to minister in this wonderful country. In order to get to my final destination required three days travelling on three planes, one past Mt Everest in a small 30 seater plane (photo right is Mt Everest and below with my host Evangelist Arjun Devkota).



Then we had a seven hour car journey through the mountains in a 4x4. Some of the roads were treacherous with a 2,000 foot drop! After what seemed like an eternity we reached Taplejung.



The town of Taplejung has less than 20,000 inhabitants. In Nepal, it is a crime to try to convert Hindus to other faiths. God is good and we had armed police to protect us from Hindu extremists!

A God of Miracles

The miracle of creation was a wonderful backdrop to the two day crusade in Taplejung.



Over 2,000 people attended the crusades with **175 responding to the Gospel**.



Two ambulances arrived on the first day bringing the lame and the crippled. God manifested His love in a tangible way by healing the sick. There were so many people healed I could write a book, but I will focus on some of the most dramatic.

The little boy on the right is five years old and had never walked until the power of God touched him. At first he needed some help but as his legs grew stronger he was running!



The little girl on the left had been deaf all her life. You can see her touching her ear telling how she could now hear. It was incredible to see this little life changed by the power of God.

The lady on the right had been blind for many years and is telling how her eyesight started to recover as we began to pray. After several minutes she was able to focus on small objects and see everything clearly. She was so grateful to see the Himalayas again.



The man pictured right and below was one of the many people brought in the ambulances.



He was a former Captain in the Gurkhas but was crippled in his legs and had a withered arm. Firstly he was healed in

his legs and able to walk.



He went to salute me but couldn't because his arm was withered. As I grabbed his right hand, his arm stretched out and I could feel all his fingers straighten out.

You can see the translator pointing and my look of joy as I felt his fingers move. It was like the man in **Mark 3:1-5**.



After getting up at 5am we had a nine hour drive to Bhadrapur. I was asked to speak in a village so small it's not on the map!



Over 200 people came along to watch Mel Gibson's movie 'The Passion of the Christ'. After I preached 40 people responded to the Gospel.

During the mission I had been asked to speak at three conferences for pastors and church leaders. One in Kathmandu, the others in Taplejung and Bhadrapur.
