As a Christian organisation Arjun's Rescue Centre receives no help from the government whatsoever. This is just another example of the persecution the church faces in Nepal.



### Nepal Mission - November 2017

It was wonderful to be able to return to this beautiful country and meet up with my friend and host Evangelist Arjun Devkota (photo below).



This year we visited even more remote communities to share the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Like last year we had to take a small plane past Mt Everest but this time we headed to Biratnagar. Then we had a four hour journey in a 4x4 to reach the town of Hile.

The population of Hile is 99% Hindu. Christians are only tolerated if they are silent about their faith.

Pastor Uttah (photo below) pastors a church of about 30 Christians.



He was not silent about his faith but preached about Jesus openly on the streets and was arrested and spent 30 days in prison.

## Meeting With Miracles

God is a God of miracles. We know this but it is always exciting to see the joy on people's faces when they are healed.

Seturam couldn't walk. He was carried to church on a stretcher...



...but walked away healed leaving his stretcher behind. Hallelujah.



At an impromptu open air meeting in a remote Hindu settlement a lady crawled towards me. She wore flip flops on her hands and dragged herself along.



In the name of Jesus she was healed. I took her by the hand and helped her up and she walked for the first time in many years.

In this settlement of about 50 people five gave their lives to Jesus. Miracles are a signpost to salvation.

We saw many other miracles during this mission – blind eyes were opened; deaf ears were opened; back pain left and much more.

## The Church in Need

We don't really understand the hardships that Christians face in some nations where Christianity is not welcome. The photo right shows an open fire to cook on which is also the only source of heat and light.



Church buildings are usually situated well outside of the towns and villages so that the Hindus can not hear the Christians praising the Lord.

They are often quite difficult to get to requiring a drive along dirt roads and then a walk down mountain paths.

On one path we saw a colony of spiders the size of saucers!

In these remote churches I ministered at two conferences for Pastors and Church Leaders. At one conference almost 250 leaders attended, some having walked for two days to get there.



At the other we saw 90 pastors. There is such a hunger for the word of God in Nepal.

The Christians were so hungry for the word of God that I had to minister for five hours in one conference and four hours in the other. And they wanted more!
